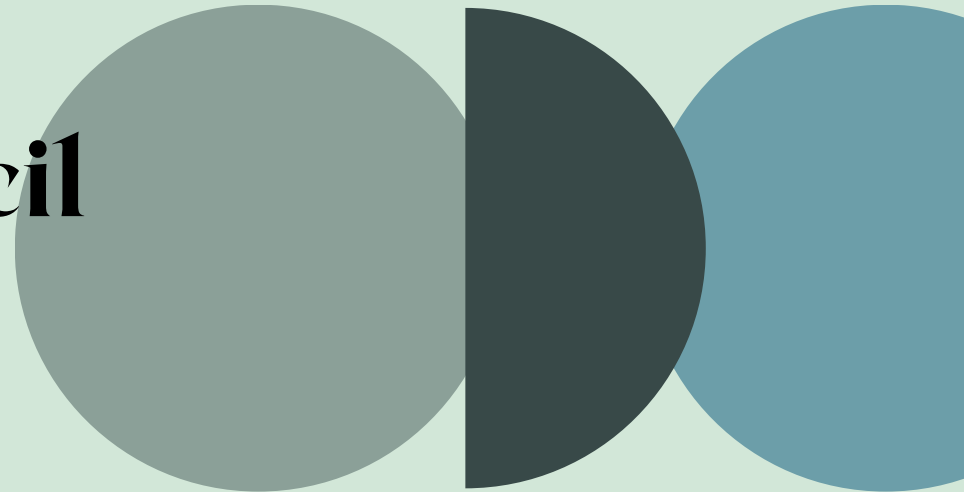

52% Property Tax Hike

On November 25th, the City Council considered a proposal by Mayor Christine Frizzell to increase the city portion of property taxes by 52%. A prior Regional Fire Authority (RFA) annexation eliminated the city's responsibility to provide fire service and, in turn, the city banked that property tax capacity. Now, however, taxpayers are being hit twice - once from the RFA and now again by the City of Lynnwood. Future 42 opposed this tax hike proposal due to the significant negative impact to city taxpayers.



Budget Adoption

On June 25th, the City Council considered a biennial budget for 2025/26 which spends \$420 million. This spending plan was made possible by the controversial 52% property tax hike which was passed earlier in the same meeting. No spending reductions were considered during the budget process. Future 42 opposed this proposal due to the significant negative impact to city taxpayers.



Police Collective Bargaining Agreements (CBA)

On August 12th, the City Council considered three contract proposals for the following police unions: the Police Guild for Officers and Sergeants, the Police Guild for Support Services Employees, and the Police Management Guild. These contract negotiations stayed within the financial parameters set by the City Council. Future 42 supported these contracts to improve public safety.
